1 Introduction

During 2012, SQA Accreditation signed a revised regulatory declaration with the Health and Safety Executive (HSE) which meant that SQA Accreditation would assume responsibility for ensuring that all approved awarding bodies accredited to offer the revised versions of the Emergency First Aid at Work (EFAW) and First Aid at Work (FAW) qualifications are compliant with the new Assessment Principles for First Aid Qualifications. The implementation date for the revised versions of EFAW and FAW was 1 January 2013.

In line with the regulatory arrangements, SQA Accreditation has agreed to continue to provide HSE with an annual report outlining its regulation of the EFAW and FAW qualifications. This report outlines the regulatory activity undertaken between 1 January 2016 and 31 December 2016 regarding approved awarding bodies accredited to offer EFAW and FAW.

In carrying out this regulatory activity, SQA Accreditation attempts to ensure that all approved awarding bodies are delivering EFAW and FAW in accordance with the Assessment Principles for First Aid Qualifications (V5 December 2016).

From 2017 SQA Accreditation will no longer provide this annual report to HSE on EFAW and FAW qualifications. However, in carrying out normal regulatory activity, SQA Accreditation will continue to ensure that approved awarding bodies are delivering first aid qualifications (including EFAW and FAW) in accordance with the unit specifications, Assessment Principles for First Aid Qualifications and all other regulatory requirements.

5 Awarding body audit and centre monitoring activity

SQA Accreditation attempts (where possible) to carry out a full awarding body audit within six months of the date of approval of any new awarding body and, from that point onwards, on a three-year cycle dependent on the Quality Enhancement Rating (QER). Annual centre/provider monitoring visits are also carried out at a sample of approved centres/providers for each approved awarding body.

In December 2014, SQA Accreditation updated the *Regulatory Principles* (2014) originally introduced in April 2014. Hence, when carrying out awarding body audits, SQA Accreditation looked to ensure that all approved awarding bodies were fully compliant with:

- ♦ the Regulatory Principles (2014)
- the Regulatory Principles Directives
- any other regulatory criteria which are applicable to the qualifications the awarding body is accredited to offer (eg the Assessment Principles for First Aid Qualifications).

When completing audit and centre/provider monitoring visit reports on any activity, SQA Accreditation will identify any issues and make recommendations on any areas where it is perceived that business operation could be improved. Action is required by the awarding body to close out any issues which form the awarding body action plan. Progress against the plan is monitored by SQA Accreditation on an ongoing basis.

To date, the audit and centre/provider monitoring activity carried out by SQA Accreditation has revealed no recurring or serious issues regarding the administration, delivery and quality assurance of the EFAW or FAW qualifications.

6 Statement of compliance with the Assessment Principles for First Aid Qualifications

SQA Accreditation can confirm that, at the time of producing this report, the evidence obtained from awarding body audits and centre/provider monitoring activity for the year 2016 indicate that awarding bodies approved to offer the EFAW and FAW qualifications were compliant with the Assessment Principles for First Aid Qualifications (V5 December 2016). There are currently no outstanding issues.

SQA Accreditation can also confirm that all awarding bodies approved to offer the qualifications during 2016 used the same standardised unit specifications and SCQF credit rating for EFAW (SCQF level 5, 1 SCQF credit point,) and FAW (SCQF level 6, 3 SCQF credit points).
