Quality Assurance of Approved Awarding Bodies Policy

Policy	<p>In line with Scottish Government's Better Regulation agenda we take a risk-based approach to quality assurance. Our Quality Enhancement Rating (QER) process informs our risk assessment of each awarding body and is used to consider the level and frequency of audit activity.</p> <p>The frequency of audit activity will depend on the time elapsed since the most recent audit and the Quality Enhancement Rating (QER) attached to the awarding body.</p> <p>As part of our Quality Assurance process, SQA Accreditation will generally conduct an audit of every approved awarding body at least:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">◆ once in a three year period◆ annual provider quality assurance activity <p>Both activities will measure an awarding body's compliance with SQA Accreditation's <i>Regulatory Principles</i>, Regulatory Principles Directives, the requirements of the clauses within and any conditions applied to the Accreditation Licence.</p> <p>The audit and provider monitoring reports will be published on SQA Accreditation's website following approval by the Accreditation Committee.</p> <p>SQA Accreditation will not publish the QER applied to the approved awarding body.</p>
Why do we need this policy?	<p>This policy details SQA Accreditation's quality assurance activities and the frequency of audit and provider quality assurance activity, the factors which contribute towards both this and their QER and that reports are made public by SQA Accreditation on its website.</p>

How does the policy apply and to whom/what does it apply?	SQA Accreditation will apply this policy to all organisations with approved awarding body status. Please note that 'provider' covers providers, centres and/or assessment locations, exam venues and any satellite sites.
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Guidelines on Quality Assurance of Approved Awarding Bodies Policy

1 Status

This policy has been approved by SQA's Accreditation Committee (AC).

The Accreditation Committee is authorised by the Scottish Government to delegate authority to the Accreditation Coordination Group (ACG).

The ACG is an internal group made up of members of SQA Accreditation and provides regular updates to the AC.

2 Process

In line with Scottish Government's [Better Regulation](#) agenda we take a risk-based approach to quality assurance. Our Quality Enhancement Rating (QER) process informs our risk assessment of each awarding body and is used to consider the level and frequency of audit activity.

Our quality assurance focus will be to ensure awarding bodies can demonstrate compliance with the:

- ◆ Accreditation Licence
- ◆ Regulatory Principles and Directives

As a regulator SQA Accreditation will ensure that awarding bodies achieve compliance by continually monitoring performance using robust quality assurance processes including:

- ◆ conduct awarding body audits
- ◆ carry out provider quality assurance activity
- ◆ carryout risk profiling of awarding bodies using Quality Enhancement Rating
- ◆ review awarding body self-assessment reports/action plans
- ◆ review and evaluate accreditation submissions
- ◆ investigate cases of malpractice and maladministration
- ◆ review complaints and appeals

We use our [Quality Enhancement Rating](#) to assess and evaluate the level of risk and ensure a fair, consistent and proportionate approach to regulation.

3 Details

The QER is calculated using the following factors:

- ◆ the number of 'Issues' raised at audit and the associated risk rating(s)
- ◆ the number of 'Issues' raised during the provider quality assurance activity and the associated risk rating(s)
- ◆ persistent failure to either meet deadlines or implement actions to close out Issues raised in the Action Plan
- ◆ compliance investigations
- ◆ extraordinary circumstances

Approved awarding bodies can obtain their QER at any time by requesting this from SQA Accreditation.

4 Appeals

All awarding bodies will have the right to appeal **any** decision made by the ACG. Grounds for appeal will vary depending on individual situations, therefore, all appeals made will be considered in their own right.
