1 Introduction

SQA Accreditation is the national accrediting body for Scotland with a statutory remit under Scottish legislation to accredit and quality assure qualifications in Scotland. Although part of the Scottish Qualifications Authority, SQA Accreditation is distinct and autonomous to SQA's awarding function.

SQA Accreditation sets and specifies the requirements for accrediting qualifications to safeguard and support the needs of learners, parents, funding bodies, employers, providers and Scottish Government. We do this by promoting and maintaining public confidence in accredited qualifications and approved awarding bodies.

This report summarises the qualification data that has been provided to us by approved awarding bodies. This information covers SQA accredited qualifications during the third quarter (Q3) of 2018–19 (1 October – 31 December 2018) and focuses on candidates who were:

- registered for an SQA accredited qualification
- certificated for an SQA accredited qualification

The data has been analysed in relation to:

- qualification type
- awarding body
- developer
- area of competence (ie classification)
- Workplace Core Skills

For upcoming data submissions, the following deadline dates apply and must be adhered to by all awarding bodies to ensure consistency and accuracy of data in future reports:



2 Accredited qualifications


At the end of Q3 of 2018–19 there were 846 live accredited qualifications¹:

- ◆ **537 SVQs** (63.5%)
- 31 Regulatory and Licensing qualifications (3.6%)
- ◆ 278 'Other' qualifications (32.9%)

¹ Note that this total does not include qualifications that are within their lapsing period.



Compared to Q2, the total number of accredited qualifications has decreased by 1 (equating to a 0.1% reduction). The number of accredited qualifications has remained relatively stable in the last three years.



2.1 Total candidate registrations and certifications





The Award in Emergency First Aid at Work at SCQF Level 6 (SQA) had the highest number of certifications in Q3 of 2018–19. Compared to figures from Q2:

• certifications for this qualification in Q3 were 73.8% higher than in Q2


2.3 Registrations and certifications by qualification type



- Compared to Q3 of 2017–18, the number of SVQ registrations has increased by 9.2%.
- SVQ certifications in Q3 2018–19 are 0.7% higher than those in Q3 of 2017–18.


Regulatory & Licensing (R&L)

- ♦ 4,957 registrations
- ♦ 4,821 certifications



In comparison to Q2:

- R&L registrations are 29.3% higher in Q3
- R&L certifications are 28.4% higher in Q3



'Other' qualifications

- ♦ 17,660 registrations
- 11,411 certifications

In comparison to Q2 of 2018–19:

- registrations for other qualifications have increased by 43.8%
- certifications for other qualifications have decreased by 10.2%

2.4 Analysis by Awarding Body

There are currently 39 Awarding Bodies approved by SQA Accreditation. Scottish Bakers, although included in this report is no longer an approved awarding body.

One new awarding body received approval status in this quarter — Smart Awards Ltd, offering the accredited qualification SVQ in Customer Service at SCQF Level 6.

The number of qualifications offered by each awarding body varies greatly. The five largest awarding bodies, in terms of qualifications offered are:



SVQs


SQA continues to have the highest number of SVQ registrations and certifications:

- 80% of registrations
- 83.4% of certifications



Regulatory and Licensing

BIIAB accounted for the highest number of R&L registrations and certifications:




♦ 39.1% of registrations

♦ 38.3% of certifications

In Q2, the awarding body with the highest number of registrations and certifications of regulatory qualifications was Highfield Qualifications, with 46.4% of registrations and 44.8% of certifications.

'Other' qualifications

NEBOSH continues to have the highest number of 'Other' registrations of this qualification type, accounting for 26% of registrations.




SQA certificated the highest number of candidates in Q3, with 2,856 certificates, accounting for 25% of certifications of 'Other' qualifications.


2.5 Analysis by developer


This section compares the registrations and certifications by developer across the three qualification types — SVQs, Regulatory & Licensing and 'Other'.

SVQs are favoured across a wide range of developers. Skills for Care and Development account for the largest proportion of SVQ registrations and certifications — 24.8% and 29.4%, respectively.



Compared to SVQs, Regulatory & Licensing qualifications are offered by a smaller range of developers, and are largely in the Security and First Aid sectors. People 1st and other awarding bodies account for the largest proportion of registrations and certifications — 37% and 36.2%, respectively.






While a wide range of organisations develop 'Other' qualifications across different industries, the majority of registrations can be attributed to a small number of developers, and hence a small number of sectors.

The largest proportion of registrations and certifications are in qualifications developed by the First Aid Awarding Organisation Forum — 31.3% of registrations and 47.1% of certifications.

2.6 Analysis by area of competence

SQA Accreditation assign qualifications to one of the following 11 areas of competence:

- 001 Tending Animals, Plants and Land
- 002 Extracting and Providing Natural Resources
- 003 Constructing
- 004 Engineering
- 005 Manufacturing
- 006 Transporting
- 007 Providing Goods and Services
- 008 Providing Health, Care and Protective Services
- 009 Providing Business Services
- 010 Communicating and Entertaining
- 011 Developing and Extending Knowledge and Skill



The area with the highest number of registrations and certifications is Area 008: Providing Health, Care and Protective Services:

- 43.1% of registrations
- ♦ 47.6% of certifications

3 Workplace Core Skills


Workplace Core Skills are the broad, transferable skills that help to develop the main capabilities people need to be full, active and responsible members of society. Workplace Core Skills were specifically developed to assess Core Skills in a work environment. They contribute to employability and are a component of Modern Apprenticeships in Scotland. Each Workplace Core Skill is available at SCQF levels 3 to 6.

The five Workplace Core Skills are:

- Communication
- Information and Communication Technology (ICT)
- Numeracy
- Problem Solving
- Working with Others

At the end of Q3 2018–19, there were:

- 145 accredited Workplace Core Skills
- 11,517 registrations (an increase of 36.7% compared to Q2)
- 7,003 certifications (an reduction of 16.1% compared to Q2)



Workplace Core Skills are offered by eight Awarding Bodies.

SQA continues to have the highest registrations and certifications for Workplace Core Skills:

- 70.1% of registrations
- 81.3% of certifications
