# **Executive summary**

This report provides statistical information on SQA Accreditation approved qualifications for the first quarter (Q2) of 2021–22 (1 July – 30 September 2021). This data is submitted by awarding bodies, who are responsible for quality assuring their data submissions.

## Accredited qualifications

At the end of this period there were 735 accredited qualifications: 447 Scottish Vocational Qualifications (SVQs), 22 Regulatory and Licensing qualifications, and 266 'Other' qualifications.

#### **Data submissions**

There were a total of 27,604 registrations (increase of 8.2% from Q1) and 23,134 certifications (increase of 4.8% from Q1) in Q2.

#### **SVQs**

Of this total, 8,024 (29.1%) were SVQ registrations and 7,521 (32.5%) were SVQ certifications. The SQA awarding body had the highest percentage of SVQ registrations (83.8%) and certifications (84.6%). The developer with the most registrations and certifications was Skills for Care and Development — 29.1% and 30.5%, respectively.

#### Regulatory & Licensing qualifications

There were 3,122 registrations and 2,903 certifications, a decrease of 0.4% and increase of 2.5% % respectively compared to Q1. Highfield Qualifications accounted for 41.5% of registrations and 42% % of certifications. The developer with the most registrations and certifications was Scottish Government — 56.3% and 59.2% respectively.

#### 'Other' qualifications

There were 16,458 registrations and 12,710 certifications, an increase of 10% in registrations and 1.2% decrease in certifications compared to Q1. National Examination Board in Occupational Safety and Health (NEBOSH) accounted for 22.7% of registrations, and 23.4% of certifications. The developer with the largest proportion of registrations and certifications was First Aid Awarding Organisation Forum — 34.5% of registrations 45.1% of certifications.

#### **Qualification category**

The area with the highest number of registrations and certifications is 003 Health Care, Social Care and Childcare, as it was in Q1.

#### **Workplace Core Skills**

There were a total of 6,302 registrations (a decrease of 15.4% compared to Q1) and 6,621 certifications (an increase of 18.4% compared to Q1).

## 1 Introduction

SQA Accreditation is the national accrediting body for Scotland with a statutory remit under the Education (Scotland) Act 1996 to accredit and quality assure qualifications in Scotland. Although part of the Scottish Qualifications Authority, SQA Accreditation is distinct and autonomous from SQA's awarding function.

SQA Accreditation sets and specifies the requirements for accrediting qualifications to safeguard and support the interests of learners, parents, funding bodies, employers, providers and Scottish Government. We do this to promote and maintain public confidence in accredited qualifications and approved awarding bodies.

This report summarises the qualification data that has been provided to us by approved awarding bodies, referred to as data submissions. This information covers SQA accredited qualifications during the second quarter (Q2) of 2021–22 (1 July – 30 September 2021) and shows the number of candidates who were:

- registered for an SQA accredited qualification
- certificated for an SQA accredited qualification

The data has been analysed in relation to:

- qualification type
- awarding body
- ♦ developer
- qualification category (classification)
- Workplace Core Skills

For upcoming data submissions, the following deadline dates apply and must be adhered to by all awarding bodies to ensure consistency and accuracy of data in future reports:



# 2 Accredited qualifications


At the end of Q2 of 2021–22 there were 735 live accredited qualifications.<sup>1</sup>

- ◆ 447 SVQs (60.8%)
- ♦ 22 Regulatory and Licensing qualifications (3%)
- ♦ 266 'Other' qualifications (36.2%)

Compared to Q1, the total number of accredited qualifications has decreased by 14. In Q2 2021–22 there were 735 accredited qualifications, compared to 847 in Q2 of 2018–19.



## 2.1 Total candidate registrations and certifications


## 2.1.1 Registrations

**27,604** candidates were registered for SQA accredited qualifications in Q2.



This is an 8.2% increase from Q1.

#### 2.1.2 Certifications



**23,134** certificates were awarded for SQA accredited qualifications in Q2.

This is a 4.8% increase compared to Q1.

## 2.2 Top ten qualifications

The qualification with the highest number of registrations and certifications was the NEBOSH National General Certificate in Occupational Health and Safety.

Registrations for this qualification are 32.2% greater.

NEBOSH National General Certificate in Occupational Health and Safety had the highest number of certifications in Q2 of 2021–22. Compared to figures from Q1:


• Certifications for this qualification are 1.8% lower.

# 2.3 Registrations and certifications by qualification type

The following figures detail the number of registrations and certifications over a three-year period, broken down by qualification type. As there are peaks and troughs throughout the year for SVQs, it is more appropriate to compare the number of registrations and certifications to the equivalent quarter from the previous year rather than the preceding quarter.

#### 2.3.1 SVQs


- ♦ 8,024 registrations
- ♦ 7,521 certifications



- ♦ Compared to Q2 of 2020–21, the number of SVQ registrations has increased by 75.6%.
- ♦ Compared to Q2 of 2020–21, the number of SVQ certifications has increased by 31.6%.

## 2.3.2 Regulatory & Licensing (R&L)

- ♦ 3,122 registrations
- ♦ 2,903 certifications



In comparison to Q1 of 2021-22:

- ♦ R&L registrations are 0.4% fewer in Q2.
- ♦ R&L certifications are 2.5% higher in Q2.

The peak in Q4 2018–19 can be attributed to the Scottish Certificate for Personal License Holders (Refresher) qualifications. The Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005 came into full effect in September 2009. A refresher course is required every five years.

## 2.3.3 'Other' qualifications

- ♦ 16,458 registrations
- ♦ 12,710 certifications



In comparison to Q1 2021-22:

- registrations for other qualifications have increased by 10%
- certifications for other qualifications have decreased by 1.2%

## 2.4 Analysis by awarding body

At the end of the second quarter there were 36 awarding bodies approved by SQA Accreditation. The number of qualifications offered by each awarding body varies greatly. The five largest awarding bodies, in terms of qualifications offered, are:



Registrations and certifications can be further categorised based on qualification type — SVQs, Regulatory & Licensing and 'Other'.

#### 2.4.1 SVQs

SQA continues to have the highest number of SVQ registrations and certifications:


- ♦ 83.8% of registrations
- ♦ 84.6% of certifications



## 2.4.2 Regulatory and Licensing

Highfield Qualifications accounted for the highest number of R&L registrations certifications:


- ♦ 41.5% of registrations
- ♦ 42% of certifications



## 2.4.3 'Other' qualifications

National Examination Board in Occupational Safety and Health (NEBOSH) has the highest number of 'Other' registrations and certifications:


- ♦ 22.7% of registrations
- ♦ 23.4% of certifications



## 2.5 Analysis by developer

This section compares the registrations and certifications by developer across the three qualification types — SVQs, Regulatory & Licensing, and 'Other'.

### 2.5.1 SVQs



SVQs are favoured across a wide range of developers. Skills for Care and Development account for the largest proportion of SVQ registrations and certifications — 29.1% and 30.5%, respectively.

## 2.5.2 Regulatory and Licensing



Compared to SVQs, Regulatory & Licensing qualifications are offered by a smaller range of developers and are largely in the Security and First Aid sectors. Scottish Government accounts for the largest proportion of registrations and certifications — 56.3% and 59.2% respectively.

## 2.5.3 'Other' qualifications

While a wide range of organisations develop 'Other' qualifications across different industries, the majority of registrations can be attributed to a small number of developers, and hence a small number of sectors.



The largest proportion of registrations and certifications in qualifications were developed by First Aid Awarding Organisation Forum; 34.5% of registrations and 45.1% of certifications.

The area with the highest number of registrations and certifications is 003 Health Care, Social Care and Childcare.

- ♦ 39.5% of registrations
- ♦ 42.7% of certifications

# 3 Workplace Core Skills


Workplace Core Skills are the broad, transferable skills that help to develop the main capabilities people need to be full, active and responsible members of society. Workplace Core Skills were specifically developed to assess Core Skills in a work environment. They contribute to employability and are a component of Modern Apprenticeships in Scotland. Each Workplace Core Skill is available at SCQF levels 3 to 6.

The five Workplace Core Skills are:

- Communication
- Information and Communication Technology (ICT)
- Numeracy
- Problem Solving
- Working with Others

At the end of Q2 2021-22, there were:

- ♦ 145 accredited Workplace Core Skills
- ♦ 6,302 registrations (a decrease of 15.4% compared to Q1)
- ◆ 6,621 certifications (an increase of 18.4% compared to Q1)



Workplace Core Skills are offered by eight awarding bodies.

SQA continues to have the highest registrations and certifications for Workplace Core Skills:

- ♦ 88.7% of registrations
- ♦ 85% of certifications
